

The Rodent Bond

Notes Toward a Boundary Practice

Urban disorder often looks like isolated nuisance. Often it is a boundary signal.

The Rodent Bond explores a different response: not reactive pest control, but a field study in stewardship, boundaries, incentives, and measurable care.

Working idea: participants join a bounded paid pilot centered on prevention, observation, and stewardship as ongoing practice.

Boundary practices explored include perimeter awareness, entry-point reduction, attractant discipline, monitoring as signal, and low-entropy maintenance habits.

Bond means trust, commitment, shared risk, and practical covenant around maintenance.

Core thought: Care practiced at the smallest boundary often scales farther than intervention.

Status: Early field notes. Pilot thinking. Working doctrine.
